

POWERS OF ATTORNEY

FEES

In our experience the most common type of Powers of Attorney are joint continuing (financial) and welfare Powers of Attorney made by a couple in which they appoint each other as the first attorney and naming other family members or friends as joint or substitute attorneys. The total price of both Powers of Attorney for a couple in these circumstances would start **from £525 (i.e. £262.50 each) excluding VAT @ 20%**. We have set out below the key stages together with any relevant exclusions.

OUTLAYS

Outlays are costs which we have to pay on your behalf which must be paid to a third party. We handle the payment of the outlays on your behalf to ensure a smoother process.

Before a power of attorney can be used it must be registered with the Office of the Public Guardian in Scotland. The Office of the Public Guardian charge a fee to register the deeds. **The current fee is £81 for each power of attorney.** Therefore, in the example of a couple, the outlay would be **£162.**
